Subject: Enrollment, tuition, budget picture to date

As discussed my team has been going through the information available now that we are a few days into student return. Some of the initial numbers re Kindergarten which are lower than anticipated so we did a deeper dive into how things look right now. Early in process findings:

- Pre-K appears to have about 25 students more than expected, increase is non-tuition. Increase in FY24 service expectations?
- K appears to be down about 25 students, cause to be determined
- CHS appears to be down about 74 students, district wide net about 50 students under
- Impacts
 - o tuition for our students in charter programs appears close to budget, 2 over (74 vs 72 budget) with a \$24K impact
 - o tuition for our students in other CTE programs appears well over budget, 10 over (34 vs 24 budget) with a \$180K impact
 - o CTE tuition revenue appears below expectations with 180 out of district participants expected and only 155 in place at this time; may be a revenue shortfall of \$450K+
 - o Out of district Special Education placements are not filled at this time and have offset the CTE impact, but this is likely to change
- Fuel oil anticipated over budget. Present consumption estimate is 187K gallons which was budgeted at \$3.09, last rate check was \$3.90/gallon. \$150K impact at this time.
- Transportation impact unclear at this time, but partnership with RIDE for out of district route options has not resurfaced. I anticipate overage here as well.

Options to consider:

- Vacancy freeze (prioritized)
- Lower occupied building temps (65)
- Cut 1 bus, statewide out of district (share)
- Grant applications, FEMA applications
- Wellness programs for health (long term)
- Reserve review

- Budget freeze 10/1/22
- Town collection of state aid (\$500K+)
- ESSER adjustment
- Review tuitions out
- Review tuitions in
- Review negotiation options

We intend to implement a budget freeze effective 10/1/22; other options to be applied/adjusted as needed. Thank you.
